HEADSTONES AND FLOWER REGULATIONS

A. HEADSTONES: Only professionally manufactured headstones of granite, bronze or marble will be acceptable for setting in the Lower Lake Cemetery District. All headstones (except for bronze headstones) must be a minimum of 3” thick.

1. No headstone shall be permitted on cemetery lots, except approved headstones (36” wide for a single headstone or 72” wide for a double headstone) or headstones placed flush with the surface of the ground and/or any approved container placed flush with the surface of the ground. All headstones must be placed on a concrete slab a minimum of 3” thick.
2. The District is not liable for damage, theft, vandalism, or deterioration of headstones.
3. Headstones will not be set until all cemetery charges have been paid in full.

B. FLOWERS:

1. Flowers allowed in cemetery vases only – no substitute vases permitted.
2. No planting in any vase of any kind.
3. Artificial flowers shall be treated the same as fresh flowers. If said flowers discolor, fade or deteriorate, cemetery employees will remove and dispose of them.
4. Every reasonable effort will be made to care for flowers placed on graves, but neither the Cemetery District nor any of its employees will be responsible for anything of a moveable character that may be lost, stolen or misplaced.
5. No person or persons shall place or pour any sand, gravel, rocks, cement, casting plaster, or metal of any kind in vases, cans or flower containers because of hazards to expensive equipment and public safety.
6. Toys, figurines, statues or other items other than flowers, will not be permitted on graves during the mowing season. These items will be placed at your own risk. The Cemetery assumes no responsibility for these items whatsoever.
7. The number of flower arrangements will be limited to the number of flower containers on the marker base. If there are no containers on the grave, arrangements will be limited to two per grave. Excess flowers will be removed and discarded.
